Great Progress

What a wonderful term we have had and praise the Lord we were able to keep going for the 17 weeks.

It was quite strange to continue straight from term 2 to 3 however we managed well by being organised and continuing to support one another.

As a result of the children's enthusiasm and teachers dedication we saw great progress by the end of term 3. The teachers have been working hard on developing their teaching in maths in order to promote mathematical thinking from the pupils and to ensure basic maths knowledge is understood not repeated. We have seen the pupils excited to learn times tables and giving developed answers maths lessons.

Reading is central learning and as such, always a focus for us at Kapumpe. This term the children have become more confident with class reading systems so that they are using every opportunity they have to practice reading. Many pupils now love to read out loud to their peers and to other adults when there is the opportunity.

We were all delighted to have a visitor from the UK for a few weeks who was able to hear every child in the school read and bring some new uniform for us

Pre-school

Mr Chola began this term with a huge farm and zoo area set up in class as their first topic was 'Animals'. The pupils have enjoyed playing with them, learning the names of them, listening to stories about them and singing songs about them. It is wonderful to see them so energized for school each morning; they line up in two smart rows outside the door desperate to go inside and see what the teacher is going to teach them. All the pre-schoolers struggle with speaking English, however their understanding of English has definitely improved. We hope that they remain just as enthusiastic to come to school and learn next year as the lessons begin to get more challenging.

Grade 1

With a full class of 25 pupils, doing activities can be a little chaotic in Grade 1 at times. However Miss Makondo has done a great job of managing the pupils, teaching them patience and helping them to listen and follow instructions. At the beginning of the topic on transport there were not only toy cars, trucks and trains to play with but also some toys big enough to ride on! You can imagine the squeals of delight as the prospect of playing with these items dawned in the children's minds. Miss Makondo has greatly improved her teaching skills while at Kapumpe so these items were not merely in the class for play but as teaching aids such as counting wheels and identifying

colours to name a few.

Grade 2

There has been a lot of change for Grade 2 this term. Their teacher, Ms Ngoma was offered a job teaching at a government school so she moved on from Kapumpe with our blessing. We appointed a new teacher, Mrs Manwene for this class. She is quite new to teaching but clearly has an aptitude for it and the pupils respond well to her. Mrs Manwene has been working hard to improve her own teaching skills and learn how Kapumpe operates. Although the teaching of phonics is new to her, the pupils are confident with their phonics routine and have been able to help their teacher as she teaches them new sounds.

Grade 3

Miss Kangoma has worked really hard with the Grade 3 class this term. It has been a challenge at times as there are a number of lively characters in this class but when they are able to use resources, see pictures in books and go outside they soon listen. One of the topics Grade 3 have been learning about this term was 'Journey's' where the pupils think about going to different places and share about times they have travelled on buses. For a class that loves to talk... imagining adventures has been a lot of fun.

Grade 4

Throughout this term, Grade 4 have become more like a family. They have been supporting each other both in lessons and during other activities at school. Academically they have been more focused and the presentation of work in their books is evidence of this. It's a real joy to see them so proud of their work and also eager to show they have done so much work that their book is now full! Grade 4 have also improved their English this term. Many of the pupils speak fluently in English and even help to translate for the younger pupils.

It has been a big jump for some pupils, transitioning from lower to upper primary this year but all of them have become more focused in class and determined to improve. They are definitely ready to be in Grade 6 next year.

Grade 6

This term one of the topics was called 'Let's Investigate' so Grade 6 have had a science focus thinking about why and how things happen such as candles melting, plants getting food and sending messages. They have also been learning about the needs of livestock and ways to manage cows, pigs and goats as keeping animals is common for many families in Zambia. Although the pupils have been working hard in the classroom, Mr Mananasi has been giving them time to play games, sing songs and ensure that they are enjoying learning.

Grade 7

It has been a very different term for Grade 7. Mrs Mwiinga was able to return from her maternity leave but it was not lessons as normal – time to get ready for exams! The lessons were a mixture of revision, exam practice and technique and study sessions. This was where the pupils learnt how to do independent study, something they will have to be doing a lot more of in secondary school. As it was our first year of having exams at Kapumpe there were lots of firsts including a mock exam week; the pupils were very excited to see their results. We know that all the pupils have improved this year and hope they remember many things they have learned from their time here.
